

World Rotaract Week 2016: 48 Years of Fellowship Through Service



In celebration of the establishment of the first Rotaract Club in Charlotte, North Carolina, USA on March 13, 1968, Rotaractors around the globe celebrate the World Rotaract Week annually.

For this year's World Rotaract Week, RACLB participated by actively posting in social media throughout the week (from March 7-13, 2016) and by having a fellowship on the 12th of March.

RACLB actively supported the Rotaract Campaign "Stand up and Be Counted". It is to encourage Rotaractors to register at rotary.org and make their membership recognized by the Rotary International. Moreover, the Rotaract Club of Los Baños joined in the MDIO or MultiDistrict Information Organization Pilipinas' hashtag of the event in every post in social media (#RotaractPH, #WorldRotaractWeek and #RID3820).

Inspired by this, the club decided to create an Instagram account to be able to get more close to other Rotaract Clubs throughout the world. To the club's surprise, the account gained a lot of followers in just a couple of days and as of June, the account already has 204 followers. Even the Rotary International official account recognized the works of RACLB. Because of this, the club was featured in the

Rotaract Official Facebook Page for the second time.

Also, the club started the hashtag #RACFact wherein the club posted and shared various facts about Rotaract, Rotary and Rotaract Philippines. Amazingly, it gained a lot of attention in Twitter and made all the work worth it.

Lastly, the group managed to assemble on March 12 despite the members being busy with their own personal lives. The group talked about the future plans for the club and other possibilities over some pizza. It was just another night but it is sure fun when you are with your family, the Rotaract family.

The play portrays a love story of the past showing how the ways of courtship have changed throughout the generations. It also compares mother-daughter relationships in the past and in the present. It was held last January 29, 2016 at the Batong Malake Covered Court. The club's sponsorship to this event also demonstrated the members' enthusiasm towards art, specifically theatre arts. RACLB believes that the art is an integral part of the society.
